

Blueprint Summary Table MCPS Benchmark Assessments Grade 6 Reading 2016-17

MCPS Benchmark tests are designed to align with the MCPS SOL benchmark guide which lists by 6-week grading period the Standards of Learning on which students should demonstrate proficiency. The options for passages and the content of the questions align with benchmark guide. The testing window for each benchmark test is given below.

Teachers should be aware that the Grade 6 benchmark assessments include question stems that students have experienced in grades 3-5. A benchmark assessment may also include previously tested 6th grade standards.

In general, test items assess word analysis strategies, use of word reference resources, and comprehension of fiction, nonfiction, functional text, and poetry, including print and digital informational materials.

The number of passages and items increase across the testing periods in order to build student stamina and establish realistic expectations for the SOL testing experience.
